MHEP Hist. Mss. 1-222. Harvey O. Moyer Collection, Upper Salford Twp., 1729-1918. Donated by Jacob M. Landis, Telford, Pa., January 24, 1991.

Description:

The Harvey O. Moyer Collection, 1729-1918, is an amazing collection of deeds, land drafts, estate settlement papers, wills, inventories, releases, bonds and related documents from six generations on the Hans Meyer Homestead in Upper Salford Twp., Montgomery County, Pa. This land was originally known as "Skippack" or Salford Township, Philadelphia County.

The homestead and these papers passed from the immigrant Hans Meyer (d.1748) to his son Henry Meyer (d.1800) who married Barbara Miller, to their son Samuel Meyer (1770-1834) m. Maria Landes, to son Henry L. Moyer (1805-1885) m. Elizabeth Landis, to Jacob L. Moyer (1841-1916) m. Fannie S. Overdorf, and to their son Harvey O. Moyer (1891-1986). The papers were given by Harvey Moyer, just before his death, to his nephew Jacob Moyer Landis of the Ridge Road in Upper Salford, who then donated them to MHEP.

Hans Meyer settled in (Upper) Salford in 1729, just after immigrating, and was probably a member of the Salford Mennonite Congregation. His original 1729 deed is in this collection as well as his estate settlement papers from 1748-1752. Many of Hans Meyer's descendants became members of the Franconia Mennonite Congregation as well. Other interesting documents in this collection include one showing a Jacob Myer joining the Army in 1757 and never returning, several early land drafts (one showing a schoolhouse lot at "Branches Bridge"), inventories, and vendue lists. This is a most unusual collection spanning six generations and almost two hundred years in one family and on one homestead.
