Priscilla Delp: A Faithful Servant

Author's foreword: This article is not intended to be a complete biographical account of Priscilla Delp's life. The author has just recently organized the Priscilla Delp archival collection and is mostly basing this article on that material. Thus, while a general sketch will be given, the article will be more like snap shots into different aspects of her life with primary emphasis being placed on her childhood years and her adult literary career.

Priscilla Delp was born 12 August 1910 in Line Lexington, Bucks County, Pennsylvania to Abram Krupp Delp and Mary Landis Lapp Delp. Priscilla was the fourth child having two older sisters, Irma and Ann, and an older brother, Oscar. Two younger brothers, Isaiah and Abram, came along after her. At the time Priscilla was born her father worked as a harness maker in Hilltown.

For her first few years, they lived next to a butcher's home. The Delps from their barn could watch the beef and pork being butchered. This bothered Priscilla as a young child. She recalls that "The animals were always sure to voice their feelings. So I used to go behind some furniture and hold my ears shut."

During these years Priscilla enjoyed how her dad would take Oscar and her on his knees and tell them stories. On Sunday afternoons her father read them Bible stories and told them about missionaries. Some of the missionary news was from India since the missionaries Mahlon and George Lapp were her mother's first cousins.

Priscilla writes that when she was four years old, her father had a nervous breakdown from working too hard followed by a severe case of the mumps. This caused her dad to be unable to work for nearly a year. So her mom took up sewing again -- she had been a dressmaker when younger; while her dad took care of the garden and the chickens. Priscilla recalled that they, the children, enjoyed this time. They now had their father all day instead of just evenings and Sundays.

As a result of their father's health problems, they moved to the country. Her dad's health improved and that winter he hired help and started a pork butchering business. The following Spring he bought a small farm north of Lansdale and built a butcher's house.

When Priscilla became old enough to start school, she walked

3/4 mile to and from the Orvilla schoolhouse every day. Her favorite subjects were history, composition, and physiology. During the summer time, she had fun building seesaws and houses out of store boxes. Priscilla writes that soon they had a small village in their orchard in which they used boards for pavement. She also enjoyed horseback riding, loading hay, and climbing trees.

In the Fall of 1922⁵, when Priscilla was age 12, the Hatfield Consolidated School was formed which meant that they now rode buses to school. That winter her brother Isaiah took sick and died on January 23, 1923. Priscilla wrote that this had a profound effect on them as they became aware of their own mortality. Her brother decided to join the Church that Spring. Priscilla herself joined the Plains Church in January of 1925.

After Priscilla's eighth year of school, she had intended to go to highschool. But one of her sisters took sick, so Priscilla had to stay home and help her mother. Then soon after she was age 14, she went to live in a doctor's home to do the cooking and help around the office. Priscilla found this quite pleasing especially so because she wanted to become a nurse. She even had the privilege of sometimes being able to watch the doctor perform minor operations. During this time of working for the doctor, she spent two summers in the Pocono Mountains. But when her brother Oscar went to Lancaster to finish his course in Pattern Making, she went home again. That same year (1926) her sister Ann was married and in the Fall of 1927, her sister Irma died.

In the Fall of 1928, Priscilla took a year of highschool at Eastern Mennonite School. But then her health kept her from continuing. So she returned home, and took a course in practical nursing at the Franklin School of Nursing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Later she further developed her nursing career by learning massage and physiotherapy at the Pennsylvania School of Massage and Physiotherapy in Philadelphia. In her later years, the Lutheran Home in Telford hired her to start an activities program and gift shop. She worked there for two years. the Hatfield Mennonite Home hired her to start a crafts program for the residents. Priscilla worked there for eight years until she became ill and required two eye operations. When her eyesight recovered, she began her massage work from home again. She retired in 1983 and moved from her home on Front Street in Souderton to Dock Manor. In February 1984, she suffered a stroke and a few months after that moved to the Eastern Mennonite Home where she stayed until her death on 23 August 1988.

However what people remember most about her life is not her career, but her willingness to be of service to others. As a youngster her mother took her along to help at Sowing Circle. By age 16, Priscilla substituted for teachers in Summer Bible School and Sunday School. Later when she taught Sunday School regularly, her class called themselves the "Gleaners Club," as they dried stringbeans, pears, and apples for relief and missions. Sometimes they would spend a Sunday afternoon making gifts for shut ins. These "Gleaners" became the Junior Sowing

Circle with whom Priscilla began a crafts work that continued for twenty years. She also held at least 30 Young People's Meetings as evidenced by surviving notes for these talks."

From the 1930s into the 1960s and beyond, Priscilla developed a literary career on the side. Between those years she wrote over 100 known published articles for such Mennonite magazines as The Youth's Christian Companion, Christian Monitor, Words of Cheer, Gospel Herald, Christian Living, and the Franconia Conference News. Most of her articles are short stories that emphasize the need to be faithful to Christ in our daily lives and in service to others. In the early 1940s, she wrote several articles encouraging the young people to stay true to the Mennonite Church's nonresistance stance. In addition, several of these articles are short biographies of Franconia Conference church leaders." Priscilla also co-authored an article with John A. Hostetler entitled "History Makes Bonnets." In this article, she traces the development and evolution of the bonnet among Christian people with specific reference made to Mennonites.12 She was an avid collector of bonnets and older costumes, many of which she donated to the Mennonite Historians of Eastern Pennsylvania.

Brief mention must be made of two other literary efforts. In 1962, Priscilla Delp published <u>A Genealogical History of the Delp and Delp-Cassel Families</u> which she had been researching for a number of years. During the course of that research, she came across a student copy of the ABC Copybook with an acrostic poem that Christopher Dock probably used in teaching his pupils. Priscilla was so impressed with the ABC Copybook and its acrostic poem that she worked to have it reproduced along with a printed German transcription and a contemporary English translation. It was finally published in 1971.

While Priscilla continued to write some beyond the early 1960s, it appears that she began to spend more of her time in other volunteer service-oriented activities. From 1960 to 1980, she volunteered much of her time in providing and directing activities for senior citizens at Rockhill Mennonite Home, Eastern Mennonite Home, and Hatfield Mennonite Home. provided physical therapy on a volunteer basis to a number of handicapped children at Pennhurst State School and Hospital enabling some children to learn to walk. Between 1957 and 1967, she was on the board of the St. David's Christian Writer Association. Priscilla was also active much of her life in a Franconia Conference writers' support group. Between 1962 and 1965, she provided support for a Korean orphan from whom she received some correspondence. She helped with the writing of Life With God radio spots and served on their board between 1973 and 1976.14 In short, it is as a speaker at Priscilla Delp's funeral said. With most people when they die, we think of them in terms of their occupation. But with Priscilla Delp we think rather of how she contributed to other people's lives.15
