PREFACE

Walter Rush was born to William M. & Susanna G. (Detweiler) Rush on 26 May 1899 in Plumstead Twp., Bucks Co., Pa. He married Hannah Gross, daughter of William & Hannah (Overholt) Gross, on 25 Dec 1920. Walter Rush died 26 Nov 1975 at the Doylestown Manor leaving behind his wife and seven children. There was another child that died at the age of two years.

In his early life, Walter Rush worked at a factory in Plumsteadville that made work gloves. It so happened that his future wife to be, Hannah Gross, worked there, too. Soon after they were married, they moved into her grandfather's house on the corner of Route 611 and Stump Road in Plumsteadville which Walter bought in 1924. At this location Walter and Hannah Gross began and operated a Texaco service station for over 50 years. With radios just coming in, Walter also took on an Atwater Kent franchise. He learned to repair radios and to vulcanized tires. On the front of his Texaco service station, he had 4 Sign which read:

Not Chance
But Choice
Determines Our
Eternal Destiny

He was a charter member of the Plumsteadville Fire Company and served as chief for 21 years. He even erected a garage on his own property to house the fire engine until a new facility could be built a number of years later.

He had two main hobbies which were photography and local history, especially local Mennonite history. He took a number of pictures and slides showing a Mennonite congregation (Deep Run East) worshipping in an old fashioned type of meeting house. He served on the Deep Run East Cemetery Committee which catalogued the numerous stones. He also served on the committee to preserve the Deep Run School House. He was also a member of the Bucks County Fire Chiefs Association and the Bucks County Historical Society.

Many of the things Walter Rush saved over his life time have now ended up in this archival collection. This collection provides considerable research material for the early to mid 1900s especially for Deep Run Mennonite Church East and other churches within the Franconia Conference. Other documents in this collection provides information on Franconia Conference programs and activities, Franconia Mennonite Historical Society & MHEP, local schools, and local businesses especially the Plumsteadville Creamery. The collection also contains significant source material on Mennonite views and actions regarding nonresistance and war in the twentieth century.

It should be noted that many of Walter Rush photographs and slides are being kept in a separate MHEP photograph collection.

Plumsteadville Dairymen's Association

Within the Walter Rush collection, there is a large series of account books from the Plumsteadville Dairymen's Association commonly known as the Plumsteadville Creamery. The following is an attempt to describe the various account books.

Treasurer's Records - Monthly

These three account books cover the following dates: 1901 - 1912, 1912 - 1929, and 1933 - 1939. These books contain records of expenses under various categories as well as records of amount and quality of milk, butter, and cheese received or produced.

Treasurer's Records - Weekly

This includes ten record books covering the time span from 1908 to 1940. These contain records of gross income for the week.
