Mary L. Bower was born on 19 Nov 1876 to Dr. Joel B. & Elizabeth Latshaw Bower. She was a public school teacher for a period of time and also a practical nurse. Outside of her job, she served as secretary and historian for Latshaw Family Association which is now extinct. She did a considerable amount of both American and European research and correspondence on and with many Latshaws. Mary L. Bower never married and died on 3 July 1961 at the Eastern Mennonite Home where she had lived since September 1949. She was buried in Fairview Cemetery, Boyertown, Pa. She was a member of the Boyertown Mennonite Church.

This archival collection is largely the genealogical records and correspondence either of or done for the Latshaw Family Association. But it does also contain records on an assortment of other surnames and local & Mennonite history. There is even a small amount of Mary Bower's personal records within the collection.

The Youth's Book on Natural Theology

This book has Mary L. Bower's name written in it on the first Contents page. On the inside cover, the following is written: Hickorytown March 25 1862.

Not included in either of the two boxes are two large scrapbooks. The one scrapbook contains mostly magazine articles that are doctrinal or Mennonite-related. The other scrapbook contains newspaper clippings that are mostly local history or Mennonite-related. In the back of this scrapbook are envelopes containing newspaper or magazine clippings including the following topics:

MARY LATSHAW BOWER, HISTORIAN

The Mary Latshaw Bower (1876-1961) collection was recently processed at the Historical Library revealing her interest in local history and genealogy. The collection was donated by her nephew Henry L. Bower of Boyertown.

Mary Latshaw Bower was the daughter of Mennonite dentist Dr. Joel B. Bower (1840-1933) and Elizabeth Latshaw Bower of the Boyertown Congregation. Joel Bower attended Mt. Pleasant Seminary and Freeland Seminary, Collegeville in the 1860's and graduated from the Philadelphia Dental College in 1867. Mary's three brothers, Abram L., Samuel L. and Daniel L. Bower, also graduated from the dental college. The various diplomas and degrees of her father and brothers were found in her collection.

Mary attended the Boyertown High School (1892-1894) and the West Chester State Normal School. In her handwritten notes of her family's history, she lists her "occupations" as "Teacher, Daughter at home, Chautauqua Nurse, Jr. Audubon, Historian, Bookshop". Mary was baptized, at the age of twenty-one, into the Hereford Mennonite Congregation by Bishop Andrew S. Mack on Easter 1897.

With her interests in Local and Mennonite history and genealogy she became the secretary and historian for the Latshaw Family Reunion and historian for the Boyertown and Hereford Mennonite Congregations. In 1935, Mary wrote and published Mennonite Church of Boyertown, Pa. With Amy Histand Gehman of Bally, PA, she authored and published the twenty page History of the Hereford Mennonite Congregation at Bally, Penna., which she sold for 25 cents in her little "bookshop" located in her home. She also assisted J. C. Wenger in his writing of the History of the Franconia Conference in 1937 by supplying him information on the Boyertown and Hereford Congregations. As her interest in genealogy grew, she became a member of a number of local and national genealogical and historical societies, associations and reunion committees.

Mary apparently lived with her father, Joel Bower, until his death in 1933 when she bought his house on South Reading Avenue, Boyertown. She lived in the house until 1949 when she moved to the Eastern Mennonite Home in Souderton. In 1952, she sold her house in Boyertown to her nephew Henry L. Bower, who became the heir to her genealogical collection. Mary lived at the Souderton Home for twelve years until her death in July, 1961. She was buried in the Fairview Cemetery in Boyertown, where her father had a lot, not the Boyertown Mennonite Cemetery of which her father was a trustee.
